25 attorneys, (“Baker”), pursuant to AZ ST RCP Rule 5.3, file this Application to Withdraw (the
26 “Application”) as Counsel of Record for Defendant, Premiere Vacation Collection Owners
27 Association (“PVCOA”), and states as follows:

1 1. AZ ST RCP Rule 5.3 authorizes counsel to withdraw as an attorney of record for
2 a party when the application is in writing, when the application states the reasons for the
3 withdrawal and sets forth the client’s address and telephone number.

4 2. Therefore, Baker and Crossland are submitting this Application in writing.

5 3. The reason that Baker and Crossland are seeking to withdraw from representing
6 PVCOA is due to a potential conflict of interest in Baker and Crossland’s continued
7 representation of PVCOA in this matter. Baker and Crossland have advised PVCOA of this
8 potential conflict and PVCOA consents to Baker and Crossland’s Application and their
9 withdrawal from continued representation of PVCOA.

10 4. PVCOA will continue to be represented by John DeWulf and Katherine Hyde at
11 Coppersmith Brockelman PLC, who are already counsel of record for PVCOA, and PVCOA
12 can be reached through Mr. DeWulf or Ms. Hyde.

13 5. The withdrawal request by Baker and Crossland is being made for good cause
14 and will not have a material adverse effect on PVCOA, which has consented to the withdrawal.

16 6. There are no unusual circumstances presented in this case which would
17 justify withholding approval for withdrawal here. This Application is filed for good cause
18 and not made for the purpose of delaying these proceedings. At this time, PVCOA is not
19 seeking an extension of time to any deadlines in this matter.

20 WHEREFORE, the undersigned respectfully requests that this Court enter an Order
21 (i) allowing Brandon T. Crossland, Baker & Hostetler LLP, and each of its attorneys to
22 withdraw as counsel of record for PVCOA in this matter; (ii) relieving Brandon T.
23 Crossland, Baker & Hostetler LLP and all of its attorneys, including but not limited to those
24 listed above, from any and all further responsibilities in connection with the instant action;
25 and (iii) granting all further relief deemed just and appropriate.
